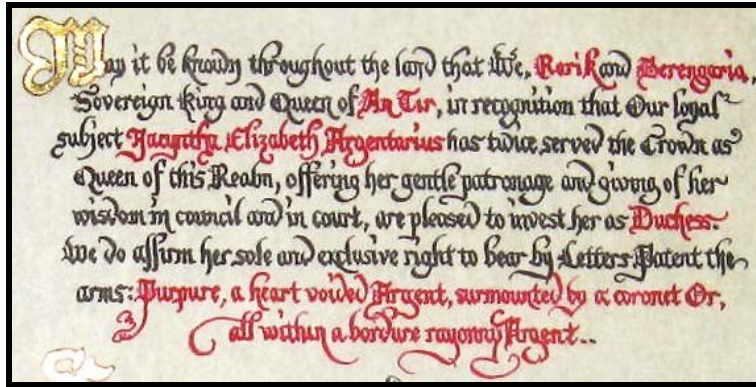


A Note on RUBRICATION

The term *rubrication* comes from the Latin *rubrico*, "to color red". On An Tir Award documents, we commonly rubricate the Name and heraldic Blazon of the award recipient. The example below shows rubrication to the names of the King and Queen, Kingdom, Recipient, Award type and the heraldic Blazon.



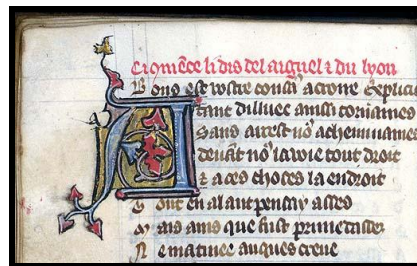

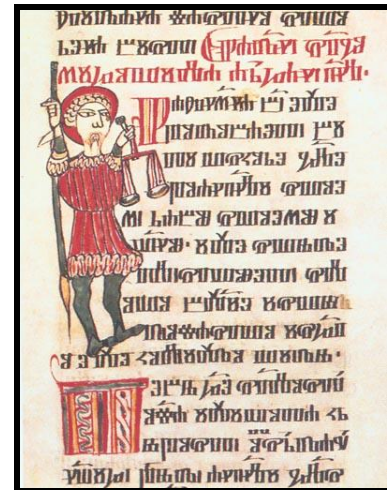
Examples of rubrication in period manuscripts are numerous and can be found in practically every culture. Three examples are shown below.
